



## YOUTH ACTION RESOLUTION

### GLOBAL YOUTH SUMMIT

JULY 31, 2026

**Topic:** Securing the Future: Ensuring Equitable Access to Opportunities and Sustainable Development for Next Generations

We, the youth of **53 countries and territories**, gathered at the **Global Youth Summit**, held in Conference Room 4 at the United Nations Headquarters, guided by the principles of the 2030 Agenda and its Sustainable Development Goals, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Universal Declaration of Human Duties for Leaders, and the principle of intergenerational equity;

Convinced that true sustainable development is impossible without the meaningful, active, and institutionalized participation of youth in decision-making processes at the local, national, and international levels;

Recognizing the rapid evolution of technology, artificial intelligence, and digital media, and acknowledging both the unprecedented opportunities they present and the risks of technological inequality, misinformation, and digital divides among younger generations;

Affirming the critical necessity of fostering mental health awareness, cultural preservation, digital literacy, and historical consciousness from an early age to build resilient, empathetic, and economically robust societies;

Acknowledging the existence of restrictive governmental frameworks in high-tension regions that limit youth mobility, cross-cultural exchange, and access to alternative educational resources;

Emphasizing that strategic, long-term investments in youth education, workforce readiness, and safe community spaces yield compounding benefits for national economies, reduce public debt over time, and foster global peace;

Having concluded the **Global Youth Summit** with a shared determination to transform our discussions into concrete actions and commitments, we, the participating youth:



1. **Commit to supporting the institutionalization** of a globally and regionally adaptable education and digital media program structured to educate youth through age-appropriate, dedicated episodes and modular curricula;
2. **Emphasize that this comprehensive initiative**, developed through the Global Youth Summit, will contribute to building a highly qualified future workforce, strengthening national leadership, and generating sustainable, long-term results;
3. **Reaffirm our commitment to working through public-private partnerships and strategic collaborations** to mobilize investment directly into community projects related to the Sustainable Development Goals;
4. **Commit to establishing international networks** that mobilize financial and material resources to support communities affected by natural disasters or located in developing and high-tension regions;
5. **Call for the creation of dedicated youth mobility projects, activities, and programs** designed to facilitate safe pathways for young people to experience international cultural exchange and educational opportunities. These initiatives shall aim to systematically increase meaningful youth participation and accessibility for younger generations, enabling them to acquire global mindsets and perspectives;
6. **Assert that universal and equitable access to structured, high-quality, human-centred education** will mitigate the risks of unregulated dependency on artificial intelligence by empowering youth with independent critical-thinking skills and appropriate knowledge of AI, thereby contributing to a sustainable future;
7. **Invite all Member States of the United Nations** to formally adopt the principles of the Universal Declaration of Human Duties for Leaders and the commitments expressed in this Resolution within their national legislation, policies, and actions, as a blueprint for protecting youth rights and securing the future of younger and forthcoming generations;
8. **Encourage the integration of JCI programs and activities developed with its allies** into both formal education systems and domestic learning environments, where appropriate, to promote inspiring and analytical conversations among students concerning mental health, cultural heritage and history, environmental care, and digital ethics;



9. **Commit to monitoring and advancing these actions beyond the Summit** by encouraging participating youth, partner organizations, public institutions, and private-sector stakeholders to share progress, strengthen cooperation, and transform the commitments of this Resolution into measurable community impact.

Finally, we encourage strategic collaboration and sustained youth engagement, guided by our belief that:

**“Earth’s great treasure lies in human personality, and service to humanity is the best work of life.”**
